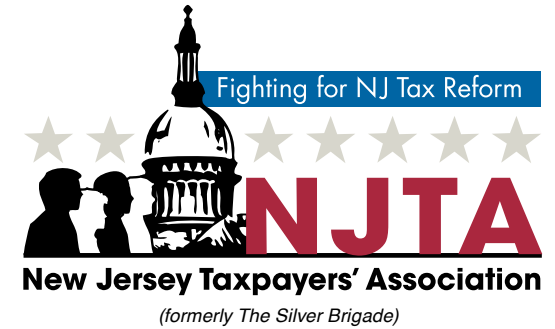

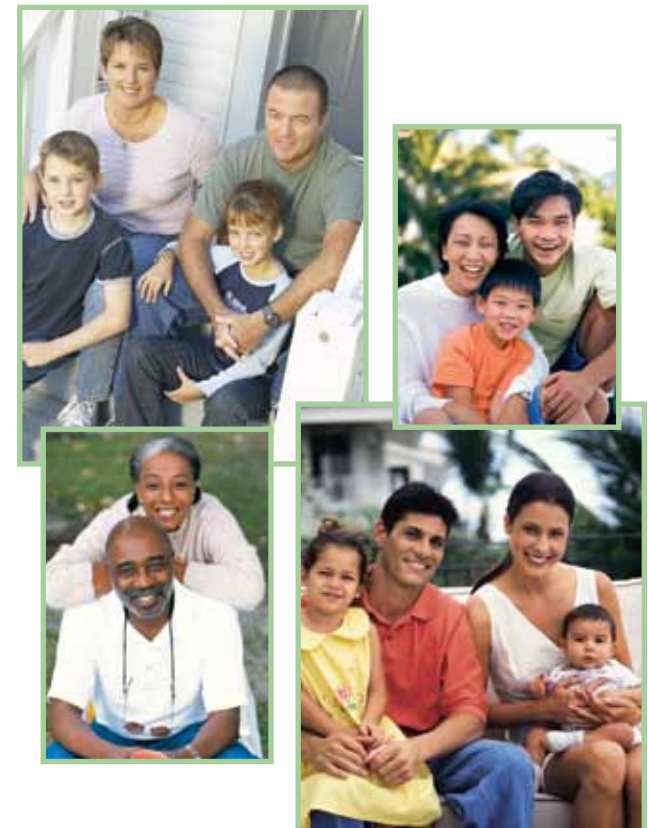

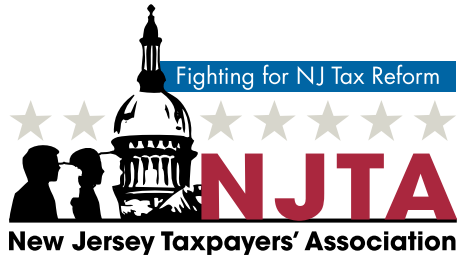

Fighting for NJ Tax Reform

The New Jersey Taxpayers' Association (NJTA - formerly The Silver Brigade) is a statewide, non-partisan, grass roots organization formed in the year 2000 by a group of concerned citizens dedicated to achieving major reforms in New Jersey's taxes. We have undertaken an aggressive campaign to reduce school and municipal reliance on taxes. The NJTA formally opposes the out of control tax increases rampant throughout the State of New Jersey.

Members annually elect a Board of Trustees in February whose job it is to set goals and plan ways of getting the New Jersey State Legislature and the Governor to act responsibly regarding fiscal matters. The current membership is made up of members from across the state including all 21 counties.



In the past year the general membership has seen significant growth, much of it coming from outside Morris County to include all residents who share the group's goals and mission. One of the group's key goals is to continue that expansion into other counties and throughout the state.

Meetings are on the first Thursday of the month and currently held at the Senior Center in Denville, Morris County, New Jersey. The Denville Senior Center is at the intersection of Route 53 (95 E. Main) and Hall (diagonal from the A&P Shopping Center). The Board meets at 9:00 AM and the general meeting begins at 10:00 AM and usually lasts until Noon.
